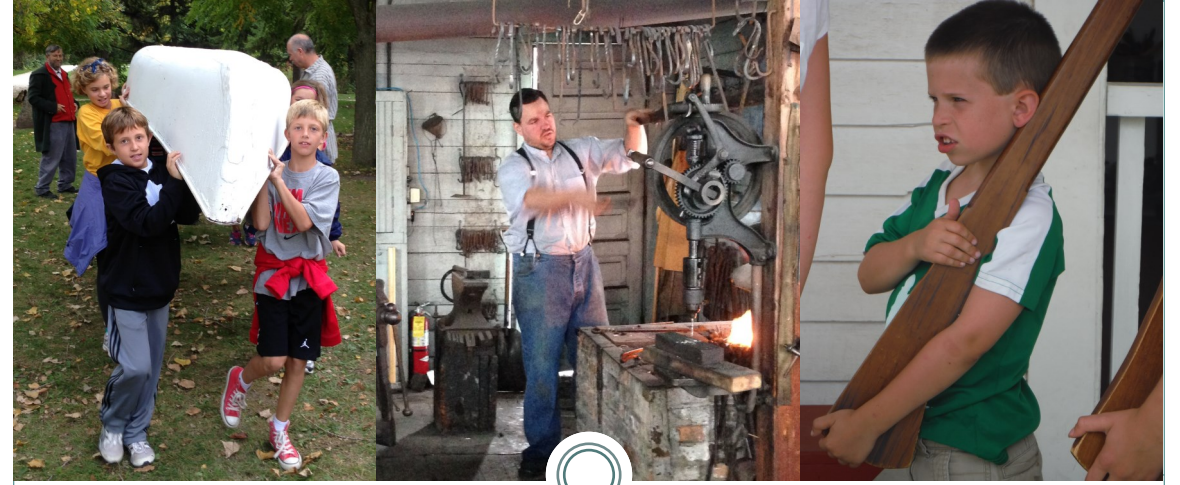

## Educational Programs at Heritage Hill 2016-2017



### Reserving Your Program

## DISCOVERY DAYS

### Life on a Belgian Farm

*Great for 2nd-3rd Grades*

Visit our 1905 Belgian Farm and learn how early 20th century immigrants adjusted to farming in America. Students will learn about immigration, make (and taste!) butter, meet the animals and do much more in this participatory experience.

### Encounter Fort Howard

*Great for 4th-6th Grades*

Experience life at a Wisconsin military outpost in 1836. At Fort Howard students will help our surgeon create healing poultices, practice marching, and participate in an 1830s school lesson.

### Explore the Fur Trade

*Great for 4th-6th Grades*

Relive the thrill of life in early Wisconsin, when Native Americans, French, and British interacted within the fur trade. Students will make sparks with flint and steel, listen to native stories, and take part in a mock trial.

**Dates:** Sept 19-Nov 4, 2016

**Maximum capacity:** 80 people per program, this number includes teachers and chaperones

**Times:** 9:30-noon; call for afternoon times

**Fees:** \$6 per student for the first program; \$4 per student for the second program. Teachers are free and one chaperone for every 15 students is admitted free; additional adults pay \$10. Passes or memberships cannot be used for admission.

## LEARNING LAB PROGRAMS

### 1848 One-Room Schoolhouse

*Great for 3rd-6th Grades*

Students engage in learning readin', writin', and 'rithmetic during this lesson set in the year of Wisconsin's statehood. A costumed schoolmarm or master will lead students through lessons in Heritage Hill's rustic classroom.

### Build a Log Cabin

*Great for 3rd-6th Grades*

This hands-on program asks students to work through the process of building a log cabin. They will choose a building site, pick a construction style and make a model of a cabin.

**Length:** 2 hours

**Max Capacity:** 40 people

**Fees:** \$100 with 1 adult for every 15 students admitted free; additional adults pay \$10. Passes or memberships cannot be used for admission.

## OUTREACH PROGRAMS

### Wool: From Sheep to Shawl

*Great for K-2nd Grades*

Learn about washing, carding, and spinning wool from a costumed presenter who brings a spinning wheel into your classroom. Students make a craft from our wool.

### An Immigrant's Journey

*Great for 1st-6th Grades*

Hear the struggles of the long journey from Germany to America in the mid-19th century. A costumed presenter brings an immigrant trunk filled with objects and documents.

### A Pilgrim's Voyage

*Great for 3rd-5th Grades*

Through story, critical thinking, and hands-on experience, students learn about the hardships of settlement at Plymouth in the 17th century. Students may try on period clothing and sample Pilgrim's Bread.

### A Soldier's Story

*Great for 3rd-6th Grades*

Explore items from a Civil War soldier's knapsack and hear about their experiences from our costumed presenter. *Please indicate at time of booking if your school will allow the presenter to bring a reproduction musket.*

### A Fur Trader's Tale

*Great for 3rd-6th Grades*

Discover the difficult life of a voyageur as a costumed presenter brings his pack with beaver pelts, metal trade items and more. *Please indicate at time of booking if your school will allow the presenter to bring a reproduction musket.*

**Length:** 1 hour

**Max Capacity:** 35 people; one teacher per class required

**Fees:** \$75 for Green Bay, De Pere, West De Pere & Ashwaubenon schools. \$100 for other Brown County schools. \$125 for schools within 1 hour of HHSHP

Book more than 1 of the same outreach program back-to-back on the same day, at the same school and the 2nd program is only \$50!

## SPRING TOURS

*Great for all ages!*

Historic interpreters challenge your students to use their critical thinking skills to discover life in this area as a fur trader, farmer, soldier, and tradesman. Students will be asked to compare and contrast today's life to that of the past as well as consider how gender roles have changed over the years.

**Dates:** May 2-June 2, 2017

**Times:** Buildings are open from 9am to 3pm with flexible start and end times. An authentic 1830s school lesson time, as well as a lunch time, will be assigned to you.

**Max Capacity:** 400 people per day

**Fees:** \$6 per student with one adult for every 15 children admitted free. Additional adults pay \$10. Passes or memberships cannot be used for admission
