

Dear Chaperone,

Thank you for volunteering to chaperone a trip to Heritage Hill State Historical Park! Each year our staff works to share Northeast Wisconsin's diverse cultural and historic ties with interactive experiences that engage, entertain, and educate visitors. You play an important role in ensuring a quality experience for all our visiting K-12 students.

Here are some tips so that you and your students have a great visit:

- As a chaperone it is your responsibility to keep your group together! Heritage Hill requires 1
 adult for every 15 students. This ensures we adhere to fire code regulations; accommodates our
 small historic buildings; ensures everyone's safety in our 56-acres; and allows all students to
 have maximum engagement with historic interpreters and hands-on-activities.
- Please stick to your prescribed route. To help ensure a good experience for everyone, groups
 will start their Heritage Hill experience at different areas of the park. If everyone follows their
 route, you will have less competition for the attention of the historic interpreters and more
 access to hands-on-activities! Groups typically spend 30-45 minutes in each area of the park.
- As a chaperone, your primary responsibility is to ensure that students under your care are
 actively and respectfully engaged during their visit. Because of this responsibility, please do not
 bring younger siblings or children.
- Remember to always be a good role model:
 - Show excitement about the trip. Your attitude can set a positive, upbeat tone for the entire day. We promise that you'll have as much fun as your students!
 - Be respectful by not talking over a historic interpreter. Remind students to pay attention to the historic interpreters and wait for appropriate times to talk. And don't forget to turn your cell phones to silent/vibrate!
 - Set a good example by helping us protect the historic buildings by not bringing food, drink, or gum inside the buildings and cleaning your lunch area.
- Please be kind. Understand that your group is one of several that will be visiting. Schedules,
 maps, lunch areas, etc. are assigned with all of our student groups in mind. Please be respectful
 to other schools by taking turns as needed in historic buildings, sharing the time of the historic
 interpreters, and adhering to your assigned lunch schedule.
- Please be aware that you may be spending a large part of the day outside. Please **dress for the** weather and wear comfortable walking shoes.
- Don't forget to capture your memories by taking as many photos as you want! We'd love to see them, too be sure to tag Heritage Hill on Facebook and Instagram!
