Heritage Hill to Present Quilts of Valor at their Textile Art Day on Saturday, August 2nd

GREEN BAY, Wis. (July 29, 2025) Heritage Hill State Historical Park will host its third annual Textile Arts Day on Saturday, Aug. 2 in the park's Textile Arts building. This year's event will feature a special highlight presentation from Quilts of Valor at 1:00 p.m., during which a beautifully handcrafted quilt will be awarded to a local veteran in recognition of their service and sacrifice.

Our returning textile experts this year will be Arachne Spinners, Green Bay Chapter of the Embroiderers' Guild of America and the Wisconsin Handweavers Guild. For the first time ever, we will be welcoming Evergreen Quilters Guild, Green Bay Modern Quilters Guild, Green Bay Featherweight Club and a special demonstration by Mary Silver who will be showcasing natural dyeing techniques over an open fire.

This event will also give visitors the opportunity to:

- View a variety of spinning wheels, past and present.
- Engage with experts in weaving, embroidery, quilting and spinning.
- Try hands-on activities using raw fibers and learn techniques firsthand.

"The Quilts of Valor presentation is an incredibly meaningful addition to this year's Textile Arts Day," said Elizabeth Jolly-Haslitt, development director at Heritage Hill State Historical Park. "Honoring a veteran in this way allows us to connect history, community and compassion in a moment that is both heartfelt and impactful."
