Heritage Hill to host Maple Sugaring Day as part of its March Second Saturday Experience

GREEN BAY, Wis. (Feb 24, 2026) Heritage Hill State Historical Park will be featuring Maple Sugaring Day on March 14th, 2026 as part of its March Second Saturday event. The event will take place from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. that day. This event that will be put on by the La Baye Fur Trade Coalition highlights the historical traditions of Maple Sugaring formed throughout the fur trade era.

This immersive living history event invites visitors to witness how maple syrup and sugar were produced more than 300 years ago. Throughout the day, guests will see 17th and 18th century Native American techniques demonstrated firsthand including tapping maple trees, collecting sap, constructing birchbark sap receptacles and boiling sap down into syrup and sugar using traditional methods.

“Come see the “sugar of the north” and the stories that brought its production into this area since before the founding of our state or nation” said Joel Barthel, Fur Trade Interpreter, Heritage Hill. “This hands-on experience reflects Heritage Hill’s mission to preserve, interpret and share the stories that define the region.”

In addition to Maple Sugaring Day activities, the buildings in our Growing Community, Tank Cottage and Cotton House will be open with interpreters in the building. Visitors are also welcome to purchase tickets at the front desk for a Birch Bark Sugar Cone workshop that will be hosted that day as well.
