Heritage Hill Connects Art and History Through a New Community Exhibit

GREEN BAY, Wis. (June 16, 2026) Heritage Hill State Historical Park is excited to announce a new exhibit that will be unveiled on Wednesday, June 24. This will be known as the Portal Exhibit which displays the diverse aspects of Heritage Hill through art.

This new exhibit will be located in the tunnel at Heritage Hill that connects the La Baye and Growing Community area. The project was made possible through the generosity of a donor who believed in the power of storytelling and community engagement. The exhibit brings together the historical perspective crafted from Heritage Hill's archives and structures with the creative and artistic efforts from Heritage Hill's Wednesday Watercolor group.

Although Heritage Hill has the term "state park," in its name, the park is managed and funded by the Heritage Hill Corporation with the Heritage Hill Foundation, local 501(c)3 non-profit entities that lease land from the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources.
