Heritage Hill Responds to Email Security Incident

GREEN BAY, Wis. (May 15, 2026) Heritage Hill State Historical Park recently experienced an incident in which an employee's email account was compromised, resulting in unauthorized messages being sent to approximately 5,600 contacts. The issue has since been contained and Heritage Hill is assessing the full financial impact of the breach to the park.

Like many nonprofits, Heritage Hill has operated for years with aging computers, pieced-together systems and limited technology resources due to funding constraints. Many of the organization's computers are more than 10 years old.

“This incident is a reminder that even historic sites cannot operate on historic technology,” said Elizabeth Jolly-Haslitt, Director of Development, Heritage Hill. “Behind every school field trip, event ticket, membership, donation and email, is technology that must be secure, reliable and up to date.”

For the past year, Heritage Hill has been working on how to modernize its infrastructure and improve accessibility for guests through expanded Wi-Fi access throughout the park. Heritage Hill's goal is to raise \$50,000 to support these critical upgrades and is currently working with local IT companies to make this happen.
